FREE ADVENT CALENDAR!

The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases,
His mercies never come to an end;
they are new every morning, new every morning:
great is Thy faithfulness, O Lord,
great is Thy faithfulness. (cf Lamentations 3.22-23)

Do you have an Advent calendar? When I grew up we had the same one each year, and carefully closed the cardboard doors after Christmas, to be opened again next year. Then chocolate Advent calendars came along! Now, it seems, the sky's the limit. But how might we each receive something new and wonderful from God every day?

The season of Advent begins on Sunday 1st December this year, which means we're completely in sync with Advent calendars! As you may know, the Church of England has Bible readings set for each day of the year and they repeat every three years, focussing on either Matthew, Mark or Luke in each year. (By the way, please don't be worried about John. His gospel is used every year at special times.) We start with a different gospel at the beginning of Advent and this December we switch from Mark to Luke.

So here's a suggestion for this month. Let's read one chapter from Luke's gospel every day. It has 24 chapters so it's one chapter a day up to Christmas. And as we open our Bible, let's pray that God will give us something new and wonderful as we read. That's a prayer I'm sure he'll delight in answering.

And if you like, perhaps you might enjoy a piece of chocolate afterwards?


